PubMed is a free resource of over 32 million citations for biomedical literature from MEDLINE, life science journals, and online books. It is developed and maintained by NLM's NCBI. Rutgers users should access PubMed via https://www.libraries.rutgers.edu/indexes/pubmed in order to get fulltext articles from Rutgers subscribed resources via Get it @ R .

A bibliographic management tool, used by researchers to store, organize, and cite references. Rutgers University Libraries provides site license for Rutgers users to download EndNote desktop to their Mac or Windows computers.

- The University Libraries are licensed to provide download access to EndNote for all Rutgers users. As a Rutgers user, you are not required to enter a product key to install the program.
- Go to: <u>http://www.libraries.rutgers.edu/endnote</u> to download EndNote.
- Note: For Windows, you must extract the zip file and place the extracted files in a separate folder from where the zip file is located. Otherwise you will be asked to enter a product key.

SOAR

Rutgers Open Access Policy

- Passed on Oct 19, 2012, implemented on Sept 1, 2015.
- For all Rutgers faculty & scholars including graduate students & postdocs.
- Requires that RU authors deposit legal copies of scholarly articles into SOAR at the time of the article's final acceptance for publication, at no cost to them, making scholarship freely accessible to the public.
- Showcases all university scholarship in one place, preserves access over time, allows authors to retain rights to their works, and ensures greater visibility & impact for Rutgers research worldwide.

- \succ ORCID stands for <u>Open Researcher and Contributor ID</u>.
- It provides a unique digital identifier that distinguishes a researcher from those with same or similar names.
- ORCID iD connects researchers and their research activities throughout their careers.

ORCID[®] provides a persistent digital identifier that distinguishes you from other researchers and allows you to connect easily to funding agencies, publishers, and collaborators. Enhancing your Rutgers directory listing with your ORCID id raises the visibility of your researcher profile and helps build an integrated Rutgers research environment.

Create or connect an ORCID iD at Rutgers
