



While it is great to enhance its functionalities, it can also be a daunting job for the busy researchers to keep up to date with all the emerging features and functions of the tool. This guide is designed to present timely tutorials and instructions on how to use EndNote effectively.

EndNote 20 is the latest version.

An important note for Mac Catalina (64-bit) Users:

EndNote X9.3.1 was released to comply with Mac Catalina 64-bit technology. Any current operating system that supports EndNote X9.2 will also support X9.3.1. Please go to <https://www.libraries.rutgers.edu/endnote> to download the new version.

An important note for Windows Users:

As a Rutgers user, you should not be asked to enter a product key to install the program. When you install EndNote on your PC, if you are asked for a product key, then you are not installing it appropriately. After you download the EndNote zip file from <http://www.libraries.rutgers.edu/endnote>, please extract the zip file and place the extracted files in a SEPARATE folder. Then clicking the installer should allow you to install the program.

SOAR

Rutgers Open Access Policy

- Passed on Oct 19, 2012, implemented on Sept 1, 2015.
- For all Rutgers faculty & scholars including graduate students & postdocs.
- Requires that RU authors deposit legal copies of scholarly articles into SOAR at the time of the article's final acceptance for publication, at no cost to them, making scholarship freely accessible to the public.
- Showcases all university scholarship in one place, preserves access over time, allows authors to retain rights to their works, and ensures greater visibility & impact for Rutgers research worldwide.



What Is ORCID?

- ORCID stands for Open Researcher and Contributor ID.
- It provides a unique digital identifier that distinguishes a researcher from those with same or similar names.
- ORCID iD connects researchers and their research activities throughout their careers.
- Sample ORCID iD: 0000-0003-0757-1837
- ORCID is the organization; ORCID iD is the unique identifier.

Steps for Adding Scholarly Works into Your ORCID Profile

Method 1 – Automatic Update

- 1 Sign in at ORCID.org
- 2 Scroll down to “Works”
- 3 Click “Add works”
- 4 From Pull-down, choose “Search & Link”
- 5 Recommend choosing CrossRef, Scopus, DataCite (will get most)
- 6 Follow the prompts from CrossRef and DataCite to have your profile auto-updated going forward

Method 2 – Add Manually

- 1 Sign in at ORCID.org
- 2 Scroll down to “Works”
- 3 Click “Add works”
- 4 From Pull-down, choose “Add manually”
- 5 Follow the prompts to add manually and complete the process
