Paul F. Weber, MD, RPh, MBA

Associate Dean for Continuing Medical Education

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Dr. Paul Weber's healthcare career spans nearly four decades. He is presently Associate Dean-Continuing Medical Education at Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson (RWJMS) and New Jersey Medical Schools (NJMS). He also is an American Medical Association (AMA) *Health Systems Science (HSS)* Academy Co-Mentor & 2020 Scholar. Dr. Weber is the Thread Director of the HSS UME Curriculum at Rutgers RWJMS and Course Co-Director for Physicianship I and Patient-Centered Medicine (PCM) 2, & 3. He serves as the Director, *Distinction in Medical Innovation and Entrepreneurship (DiMIE)* Program, Course Director for the *Biomedical Entrepreneurship Network (BEN)*, *Managed Care and Healthcare Policy and Emergency Preparedness* electives, and Faculty Advisor for the Choosing Wisely STARS Program and BEN and Miles of Smiles Student Interest Groups at RWJMS.

Dr. Weber actively teaches (virtually and in person) health professions students predominantly in Medicine in small group, interprofessional, and lecture settings. In **2021 & 2019**, he received "Excellence in Teaching" Awards from the graduating MD students at RWJMS. Earlier, as Volunteer Faculty in the Department of Medicine, he was twice named a *Teacher of the Year*. His scholarly interests include HSS/Healthcare Policy and Medical Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Technology.

Immediately prior to his current academic career, Dr. Weber spent 25 years in the Pharmaceutical and Biotech industries. In his last industry position, he was Celgene Corporation's (now Bristol-Myers Squibb) Executive Director, Global Professional Advocacy and Policy. At Celgene, Dr. Weber also was the Global Medical Affairs Leader for Thoracic Oncology where he led the Medical Affairs US Launch effort for Abraxane® in Non-Small Cell Lung Cancer. He also served as the Medical Affairs point person for solid tumor pipeline agents and Lymphoma Medical Affairs Disease Lead while building and co-leading a new Solid Tumor Medical Affairs group.

Over this span, Dr. Weber also held line management and matrix team leadership roles at Hoffmann-La Roche (Roche), Schering-Plough (now Merck), PTC Therapeutics, and Medicis (now Bausch Health Companies) that have encompassed Clinical R&D, Medical/Scientific Liaisons, Medical Information, Continuing Medical Education, Scientific Communications, Medical Marketing, and Evidence Based Medicine with predominant therapeutic area experience in HIV/AIDS, Oncology/Hematology, Rare Diseases, and Dermatology. He served the physician leader for the US commercial launches of **seven** HIV/AIDS and Hematology/Oncology products with Managed Care and Pharmaceutical Advertising experience.

Dr. Weber continues to advise and mentor students including those in dual PharmD/MD degree pathways, PharmD and Physician fellows, and residents on career paths and coach health professions colleagues through career transitions. He also is an avid endurance athlete having completed over 60 marathons including 10 Ironman triathlons, numerous long-distance bicycle rides and swims, and the Empire State Building stair climb which predominantly have benefitted charitable organizations.
